PROFILE

Dr. Jonathan Fruoco is Adjunct Professor of English and Associate member of the Center of Anglophone Research at Paris-Nanterre University. His research focuses on the linguistic and cultural evolution of medieval England, with a particular interest in the polyphony of Geoffrey Chaucer's work. He also explores the legacy and adaptation of medieval literature in postmedieval contexts, examining how medievalism shapes modern interpretations of the past.
